Seno K/RLT seeks to provide lots of opportunities to do just that, both at our Seno Woodland Center in Burlington and other public properties. Bring the whole family for some nature and outdoor fun! Try your hand at tracking animals through the snow, welcoming bluebirds to their houses in Spring, crafting original art made from nature, launching a kayak during the long days of Summer, learning the maple syrup-making process, and hiking the trails to take in the glow of the Autumn colors. Almost nowhere else in the region will you find such a prolific bog of tamarack trees among the rolling glaciated terrain of woodlands and prairies! Nature is our cathedral, and Seno K/RLT continues to work to protect these special places and habitats. De-stress, observe, reflect, and take solace in natural communities protected by your support. Such places are often under threat from increasing development pressure, invasive species, and the effects of climate change.

Seno K/RLT wants to ensure access to the natural world well into the future for families, scientists, naturalists and all those who value nature. Membership continues to be vital to support our vision. Your membership or contribution helps Seno K/RLT to conserve, protect, and ensure the legacy of natural lands for future generations. It helps us serve tomorrow's children, today.

As we look ahead to 2024, we celebrate the positive results and impacts of Seno K/RLT's actions during this past year. With your help, Seno K/RLT:

- Continued the monitoring of our 21 conservation easements that protect over 1000 acres of land.
- Provided natural resources education programming to over 700 students in Racine & Kenosha made up largely of children from historically under-represented demographics in land conservation.
- Planted 350 walnut, red oak, and white oak seedlings, and roughly 1000 additional pin oak and red oak acorns will be planted this December
- Managed roughly 30 acres of native prairie and reseeded 7 acres in spring 2023
- Hosted 7 events at our Woodland Center where we invited the public to learn about, enjoy, and experience our protected property and historic 1890's barn.

- Managed 130 acres of woodlands via sustainable forestry practices.
- Initiated 3 new land conservation projects that will protect and additional 331 acres of farmland, woodlands, and wetlands in Racine County.

Seno K/RLT welcomes all visitors, especially those who have not yet taken our classes or walked our trails. Everyone is invited to drop by, as our trails are open dawn to dusk at our public preserves, free of charge. Discover and connect; Our vision to build a mutually beneficial link between people and the natural community remains integral to the future of land conservation. Please become a member today or renew your expiring membership to help keep the trails maintained, the buildings sound, and the woodlands healthy. Donations also enable the protection of both existing and new conservation easements and lands in Kenosha and Racine.
